## Teachers begin slowdown

Plymouth teachers began this week a job action which most would describe as a "slowdown."

The teachers union, Plymouth Education Association (PEA), has instructed its members to limit their working day only to those hours when pupils are in the building.

The administration has cautioned the PEA that teachers are obligated to work certain hours beyond the time pupils are in the buildings and have warned that disciplinary action could result from the "job action."

Teachers began the "shortened day" Monday, appeared in force at Monday night's school board meeting, and made plans to begin picketing the board of education offices this coming Monday.

The movement by the PEA represents an escalation of the union's attempts to gain public support and to urge the community to apply pressure on the school board to reach a settlement.

The action, although falling short of a full-fledged strike, is interpreted by administration as a "withholding of contracted services" and is seen as being a "partial strike."

CANDI REECE, current PEA president, commented: "The school board gave teachers its 'working rules,' which included an agreement to pay us our 1975-76 increment as of Oct. 1. Now it's said the increment will be paid as of Oct. 22. There seems to be some indecision by the board on this, just as there is indecision in response to our offers at the bargaining table."

"And so we have formed our 'work rules' which represent a type of job action. We are taking this action, in part, because a board negotiator at the table once expressed doubts whether teachers would support their bargaining team."

"During our meetings with the membership last week, many teachers said they wanted to do something to demonstrate their support."

A large number of teachers were in the audience at Monday night school board meeting, wearing "Teachers Care" name-tags, to compose most of the crowd of about 500. Al Nurmi, chief negotiator for the PEA, explained: "Teachers wanted to do everything positive—short of a strike—to demonstrate support for their bargaining team and its position. And so part of our job action will be to turn out in force at subsequent board meetings."

MCKINLEY explained that the PEA "work rules" basically state teachers won't put in any extra time beyond the hours students are in class.

"That means teachers won't show up for an open house or for staff meetings. Starting Oct. 18, teachers won't perform noon duty or bus duty, and during off-hours we will begin to picket the school board offices," McKinley added.

"From Oct. 18 teachers also will refuse to engage in any after-school activities—except for those which cannot be postponed because they cannot be rescheduled, such as sports."

"Our 'work rules' also mean that teachers won't recognize an inservice day because that hasn't been negotiated or tentatively agreed upon yet. There's an inservice day the administration has called for on Oct. 22, but teachers will report for duty as things now stand."

NORM KEE, chief negotiator for the school board, said the administration has sent a memo to the PEA advising that the suggestions on job actions made by the union weren't in keeping with the work rules established by the administration.

"Because teachers are working without a contract, the administration is under obligation to establish work rules. That has been done and what the PEA is now suggesting that teachers do is contrary to those work rules."

"We expect teachers to follow provisions in the 1975-76 contract, plus matters on which we have reached tentative agreement."

"The administration has advised the PEA that it should rescind its unilateral directives because they are inconsistent and contradictory to established work rules and common practice for teachers," Kee added.

"The PEA leadership is responsible and liable for such job actions. What they are suggesting involves 'working and striking' because they propose that teachers show up for class but withhold other contracted services. There are some obligations teachers are under."

Kee said the memo to the PEA did include a caution that disciplinary action might be taken. "We haven't said what action will be taken, when it will be taken, or even if disciplinary action is taken because we hope to avoid such a move."

"But we have reached some tentative agreements which spell out when teachers shall come and go. That's an obligation. Under last year's contract, teachers agreed to report for school 15 minutes before classes open and 30 minutes after classes end, or vice versa. That also is an obligation. We believe that staff meetings is something to which teachers are committed to do. 'I will admit there are some job actions suggested where it might not be so clear whether an obligation exists. The inservice day, for instance, hasn't been negotiated yet as the calendar is part of the contract."

"The administration isn't going to move in haste, and take any quick actions against teachers. We just wanted to make sure the PEA was aware that its suggestions violate current agreements and that disciplinary action could result," Kee concluded.

JOE GRAY, board president, issued a statement just prior to the citizens portion of Monday's meeting.

"We appreciate that the teachers are currently working under last year's contract. Any type of disruption of the educational process could have a harmful effect on the progress of negotiations. As evidence of our good faith and confidence in our professional staff, the Oct. 22 payroll will include payment of all salary increments."

"I want to emphasize that the board of education has shown flexibility, patience, and perseverance in seeking a contract with the PEA. The board has made six different proposals. Our team has attended 36 formal negotiation sessions and spent more than 130 hours at the table."

"Through all these long weeks of talking, the two negotiation teams have come closer to an agreement," Gray continued. "Both sides sincerely want a fair settlement, but we differ on how to define what we mean by fair and equitable."

"State labor laws restrict release of information about offers on the negotiating table. We hope to maintain direct communication with teachers and not use publicity to create bad feelings. I want to make it clear before any citizen speaks, that the board does not intend to negotiate at a board meeting. Collective bargaining must take place at the negotiating table."

IN RESPONSE to Gray's statement, McKinley noted that the PEA also was present at all 36 formal negotiation sessions covering more than 130 hours.

"We have made every effort to reach a

## Tape recording denial termed illegal by atty.

An attorney for the Michigan Townships Association disagrees with Canton's attorney, Bert Bergoyne, regarding the legality of the township's May 13 resolution which bans any board member from taping a Canton board meeting.

MTA Attorney John H. Bauckham states that a board member has just as much right as any citizen to tape a township board meeting, even if there is a Canton resolution prohibiting officials from taping the proceedings.

The May 13 anti-taping resolution was a controversial one at the time and passed by a 4-3 vote. The "Greenstein Team," consisting of Supervisor Robert Greenstein, Treasurer Carl Parsell, Clerk John Flodin and Trustee Jerry Cheske, voted to ban taping by board members, saying that the tapes could be used in court as evidence against the township.

"You're a developing area," stated Bergoyne at the time, "and your new land use plan will bring more lawsuits."

On May 14, the day after the taping ban, Greenstein called in two Wayne County Sheriff's deputies to eject trustees Bob Myers and Brian Schwall who continued to tape the regular meeting.

The deputies said they could not enforce the township resolution. The trustees relinquished their recorders to the audience after Trustee James Poole made a motion to ask for another legal opinion on whether board members could tape meetings even if a board resolution prohibited it.

ON SEPT. 17, Bauckham, delivered an opinion which states board members do have the right to tape meetings.

"We previously rendered an opinion for another member township of Michigan

Townships Association on this subject on April 2, 1975," writes Bauckham. "We pointed out in that opinion that although there are some criminal penalties for recording private conversations without the consent of all parties, these statutes do not pertain to public meetings or public conversations."

"Many township clerks use a tape recorder to assist them in drafting more accurate minutes," Bauckham wrote. "We believe that any other township board member would have a similar right and that the township board could not curtail such a right."

"We do believe that board members and the public present should be made aware of the fact that the meeting is being recorded, either by an announcement to that effect or by the obvious presence of a tape recorder. This would avoid any claim of surprise or infringement of any personal or property rights."

"Any tape recordings pose some difficulties with regard to their use in evidence in a court of law," the attorney continued. "They must be carefully authenticated and

satisfactorily shown to not have been in any manner edited. We do not believe it would make any difference in their production as evidence whether the tape recording device was owned or operated by a township board member as distinguished from a private citizen. This would be especially so if they were not officially authorized by action of the township board."

BAUCKHAM RESPONDED to another question put to him by Poole, regarding the question of whether a supervisor can also be police chief. Bauckham said the supervisor is automatically empowered with law enforcement functions.

Township board members may be delegated additional functions and may be paid additional compensation for the same," Bauckham states. "Police commissioner was one of the additional functions discussed in this court decision (Burton Township v. Speck)."

Trustees Schwall and Myers talked about bringing a tape recorder in to tape Tuesday night's meeting but showed up without one.

## Substitute debate wholly boycotted

Members of the political team of Canton Supervisor Robert Greenstein may end up debating each other this Friday night instead of the political foes they hope to defeat Nov. 2.

Although members of the Democratic Club of Canton have invited "all persons who have publicly announced their candidacy for township offices" to a debate this Friday at 7 p.m. in the Plymouth Canton High School cafeteria, no one except members of the Greenstein slate who were defeated in the August primary plan to attend.

According to Pam Phillips, vice chairperson of the Democratic Club of Canton and secretary to Greenstein, a candidates night scheduled for Oct. 20 by the League of Women Voters of Northville-Plymouth-

Canton-Nov. 2, the American Association of University Women and the Miller Community Action Council, triggered club members' decision to schedule the debate.

In accordance with national LWV policy, sponsors of the candidates night voted to exclude Greenstein and other members of his team who were defeated in the primary from participating. The supervisor's team hope to win election in November through a write-in effort.

"We thought the League's responsibility was to represent the political realm as a whole," Mrs. Phillips protested. "But they're being discriminatory. The people of this township have a right to get to know all the candidates. That's what this debate's about."

But none of the certified candidates contacted by the Observer said they plan to attend Friday's debate. Even township Clerk John Flodin, the only member of the Greenstein team who won nomination in the August primary, says he just learned of the alternative debate and may not attend the session.

Patricia Dombecki, candidate for township clerk on the Republican ticket, was the only candidate unavailable for comment.

Mrs. Phillips said officers of the Democratic Club of Canton might cancel the debate, intended to publicize views of Greenstein, township Treasurer Carl Parsell, Trustee Gerald Cheske and trustee candidate Joyce Willis, if the certified candidates refuse to attend.

In a certified letter delivered to candidates last Saturday, Democratic Club secretary Jack Blumenshine invited the township board hopefuls to the session and requested a reply by Tuesday.

Blumenshine handled fund-raising for the Greenstein team during the primary race.

"We are sure you will agree that the people of Canton have a right to know all their political choices as guaranteed by our democratic system," Blumenshine wrote. "Any effort to try and suppress this right can only be assumed to be a measure to withhold information from the people of Canton."

Ironically, Democratic Club of Canton members apparently failed to send the invitation to Flodin, the only member of the Greenstein slate whose name will officially appear on the November ballot. Flodin said he has scheduled a hunting trip with friends for this weekend.

"I had planned to go away," the clerk said. "No one told me about it."

Trustee Jim Poole, who is seeking reelection on the Republican ticket, said Democratic Club members failed to send him an invitation also. The trustee has planned a fishing trip for this weekend.

"Let them have a press conference if they want publicity," he said.

"Other certified candidates contacted by the Observer did not hesitate giving their replies to the invitation."

"Thanks, but no thanks," wrote Republican treasurer candidate Bart Berg in a letter to Blumenshine. "Three incumbent Canton officials were put out to pasture in the primary held on Aug. 3. In other words, they were politically gelded."

"In the horse world, when stallions have been gelded after being in service for a number of years they have a very difficult time realizing that something has been taken away from them. I am sorry I have to use this kind of comparison, but that is the way I see it."

The certified supervisor candidates, Democrat Harold Stein and Republican Peter Bundarin, are in complete agreement when it comes to the invitation for Friday's debate.

"I will not participate," Stein said unequivocally. "I feel it's a waste of time. I'm concerned about the competition—a Republican whose name will appear on the ballot."

Bundarin agreed. "I feel the Democratic Party made its choice in August. I recognize that choice, and I respect their decision."

"Mr. Greenstein is a very strong Demo-

## Topical fluoride plan started in schools

Plymouth-Canton school children are presently taking advantage of a \$4 Topical Fluoride Treatment program going on through the end of November in the Plymouth Community School District.

Sponsored by the Plymouth Association of Dentists, the program places a dental hygienist in each elementary and middle school during the month of November.

The \$4 cost-per-child includes a dental care kit in addition to the cleaning and fluoride application. The dental kit consists of a toothbrush, toothpaste and two tell-tale red tablets.

The tablets are chewed by students before they begin brushing, and turn the students' mouths and teeth bright red. After brushing, any area that remains bright red indicates places that were missed by the toothbrush. The fluoride and red alert demonstration is accomplished in one session.

Field Elementary students have been receiving the fluoride treatment this week; Eriksson Elementary students start Oct. 31; Nov. 18 is set aside for Gallimore students and the hygienist will be at Fiegel following Thanksgiving break.

## Fund gives 1st report

Industry has taken the lead in contributions to the Plymouth Community Fund.

Gene Kornegay, Fund campaign chairman, made the announcement at a division chairmen's report meeting Monday at the Plymouth Hilton Hotel.

The Community Fund kicked off its contribution drive on Sept. 23. In the first progress report, the industrial division led the six other campaign divisions with contributions of \$3,675.

Businesses followed with contributions of \$1,115. Professionals were next with \$920.

"We still have a long way to go to meet our goal of \$244,000," Kornegay said. "But I have every confidence that it will be reached."

Kornegay said that this year's total represents a six per cent increase over last year's because of "inflationary-type increases in operating costs for the agencies."

# Might rename district to strengthen Canton identity

The Plymouth Board of Education has asked for a study to be conducted on the possibility of changing the school district's name, possibly to the "Plymouth-Canton Community School District."

The administration was directed to study the feasibility of name change in a motion offered by trustee Tom Yack of Canton and approved 6-0 by the board.

The study would give consideration to a name which "more accurately reflect the composition of the school community."

The direction also asks administration to develop a plan to facilitate citizen input into the name changing process.

JOE GRAY, school board president, said the idea of changing to the name "Plymouth-Canton" had been brought up at board workshop sessions and he appreciated the Yack motion because it was "an excellent move and long overdue."

Superintendent John M. Hoben reported that he had already directed Florence Beier, community relations director, to prepare a recommendation on a name change for the next school board meeting. That recommendation will include an explanation of procedures to follow and a summary of relevant passages of school laws.

Trustee E.J. McClendon said he approves of putting the item on the agenda so residents can contact board members with suggestions or attend the next school board meeting.

THE BOARD also unanimously approve the appointment of Patricia Gibbons as assistant principal for Pioneer Middle

School. She is a product of the district's administrative intern program.

The board also presented a certificate of merit to Mrs. Dorrin Bianco for her service as co-chairperson of the district's safety committee.

Marcia Borowski was named the board's representative to a school dedication committee to make plans for the formal dedication ceremonies for Field, Hulsing and Eriksson elementary schools.

In other action, the board adopted a resolution permitting school district residents 65 and older free access to Continuing Education courses and school district general admission activities.

Superintendent Hoben reported the administration is negotiating with the federal government for funds to expand services to senior citizens. If funded, a pilot project would be established with Plymouth, Wayne-Westland and Ann Arbor districts participating.

THE BOARD ALSO directed the administration to obtain a legal opinion on "condemning undeveloped land in the school district for the purpose of obtaining the most desirable and suitable sites for new schools."

In related action, the board instructed the administration to study the feasibility of updating the district's maximum utilization study so the school board could consider alternatives to building new schools before having to make a decision on seeking voter approval for a construction bond issue.

# I-275 nears completion through Canton area

A four-year, \$250 million road project to connect Livonia, Plymouth and Canton residents with the state's largest freeway interchange and I-75 in Monroe County, is near completion.

I-275, running north and south for the most part, will cut a seven-mile stretch through both Plymouth and Canton townships. The new highway will run parallel to Haggerty Road and stretch 45 miles in its entirety.

State Highway Department officials project the new expressway, from Michigan Ave. to the massive 633-acre interchange with I-96 and I-696 in Farmington will be completed by mid-November. The freeway is already open from Schoolcraft south to Ford, and the Schoolcraft north to the interchange strip should be ready in a month.

"CONSTRUCTION IS MOVING along ahead of schedule," said Frank Simmons, an assistant for the state highway department.

"There's a chance the entire I-275 will be open by the end of the year, should mother nature cooperate. That would put us a full year ahead of schedule."

The normal construction season ends Nov. 15, which is the date the expressway is slated to open, with the exception of the seven-mile gap between Ford and I-94. If the weather holds up and workers are able to continue until late December, the possibility exists of completing I-275 in its entirety.

"We've accelerated construction on I-275 and would like to get it finished by the end

of the year," Simmons said. "It wasn't scheduled to be completed by fall of '77, but we would be leaving a crucial gap open between Ford and I-94."

"If the weather holds up, the chances of completing the section will be exceedingly better. We've got at least eight different companies working on the job right now and would very much like to see I-275 finished."

CONSTRUCTION ON I-275 started more than three years ago with the building of bridges at Schoolcraft and Ann Arbor roads. Since then, the project has moved at a fast pace, culminating with the recent opening from Ford to Schoolcraft.

This week, workers were laying concrete south of Ford Road in Canton Township. The pouring operation of the expressway consists of several complicated procedures. First, an auto-grader will grade and level the ground surface of the road for the concrete spreader.

The first spreader will deposit seven inches of concrete onto the graded road. Then, steel-mesh reinforcement is placed over the first layer and another spreader pours three more inches of cement on the mesh. This is the final pouring step of the individual lanes.

Once the concrete is hard enough to support heavy-duty equipment, the trimming or median-shoulder pouring begins. This completes construction on the driving portions of the freeway. Crews will then begin the landscaping, lighting and other projects needed to complete the overall roadway.

WHEN COMPLETED, area residents

will be able to get on I-275 via any of three entrance ramps—Ford, Ann Arbor and Schoolcraft roads. I-275 and I-96 will be dualled from Schoolcraft to the big interchange in Farmington, where I-275 will end and I-96 heads west to Lansing.

While I-275 is nearing completion, the proposed M-14 freeway has a long way to go. The highway department awarded its first contract for M-14 in June and work began July 14 near Hines Drive. M-14, which will run east and west from I-96 to the north bypass in Ann Arbor, is scheduled for completion in late '78 or early '79.

## Greenstein's name is on Stein salute

Canton Township Supervisor Robert Greenstein has been placed in the uncomfortable and ironic position of having his name appear on the mass mailing announcing the endorsements of the 15th District Democratic Party.

The endorsement letter which was mailed to Canton voters, endorses Harold Stein, Anne Bradley and Eugene Daley—the members of the Democratic party who won the Aug. 3 primary.

However, on the left side of the 15th District stationery is a listing of the officers in the 15th District Democratic Party and Greenstein's name is included on the document which officially endorses his arch-rivals.

Greenstein is a trustee on the district's Democratic executive board and is presently waging a write-in campaign for the office of supervisor against Stein and the certified Republican candidate, Peter Bundarin.

Greenstein said he was not aware that his name was on the 15th District's mailing, but said even if he did know he probably would not have objected.

"The 15th District automatically endorses any Democrat who wins in the primary," Greenstein said, "just because they're Democrats."

"HOWEVER, LET there be no hesitation, I emphatically do not endorse Stein, Bradley and Daley for any job in the township. My name was on the stationery because I am a trustee in the 15th District Democratic Party."

Greenstein was asked if his decision—and that of state mates Carl Parsell, Jerry Cheske and Joyce Willis—to participate in a write-in was met with criticism from party officials.

"We've received no pressure whatsoever from the 15th District regarding the write-in," Greenstein claims. "My relation with them is excellent. As far as they're concerned it's a fight between Democrats and may the best man win."

Vincent Pettipren, chairman of the 15th Democratic Party, said the Democratic Party is not pleased with the news of the write-in.

"Mr. Greenstein was defeated," said Pettipren. "If he were a good Democrat, after his defeat in the primary, he would have supported the Democratic candidates."

"THE FIGHT between Democrats was in the primary. The 15th District looks very negatively on anyone who disregards the primary results and tries a write-in. All a write-in does is help the Republican candidate. The history of write-in is always failure."

"I talked to young Walter Hink, who ran against Royce Smith in the primary," said Pettipren. "He's supporting Smith in the general. He says that he'll run against Smith again, but the point is he's supporting Smith. That's excellent."

Greenstein said it makes no difference to the voters of Canton what the Democratic hierarchy has to say about endorsements.

"Either they want us, or they don't," Greenstein said.

## Myers to set up consumer laws

Canton officials, businessmen and a state consumers advocate will soon put their heads together over the rough draft of a model consumers protection ordinance.

Canton Trustee Robert Myers has proposed a meeting between township officials, a representative of the Canton Chamber of Commerce, a representative of the Michigan Chamber of Commerce, and Linda Joy, director of the Michigan Consumers Council, to draft the model ordinance for Canton and other communities which could vote to adopt it.

Myers said he would present the ordinance's rough draft to township attorney William Sempliner for legal scrutiny and then introduce the document to township board members.

Although Myers hopes to begin the drafting process as soon as possible, the date for the meeting has not yet been scheduled.

Myers' proposal follows a decision of Michigan Atty. Gen. Frank Kelley, who recently ruled that townships have the power to establish consumer protection agencies with the power to license businesses. The decision overturns a contradictory opinion, delivered by Sempliner more than a year ago.

After the township attorney negated the authority of townships to establish consumer groups, township board members tabled a controversial consumer protection ordinance, drafted 1½ years ago by Myers and attorney Peter Bundarin, now supervisor candidate on the Republican ticket.

The controversial ordinance had come under heavy fire of Canton businessmen and Chamber of Commerce members, who said the document would add an unnecessary restriction to businessmen's activities.

Even Bundarin, who copied the ordinance from a law enacted in Prince George County, Md., now says township officials should reevaluate the proposed law.

Under the controversial consumers protection ordinance, township officials would establish a consumer protection agency, composed of one township board member and four volunteers appointed by the board.

THE AGENCY could conceivably hold power to license all businesses in the township, investigate and hold public hearings on consumer complaints, and, if necessary, seek injunctions against businesses O&E

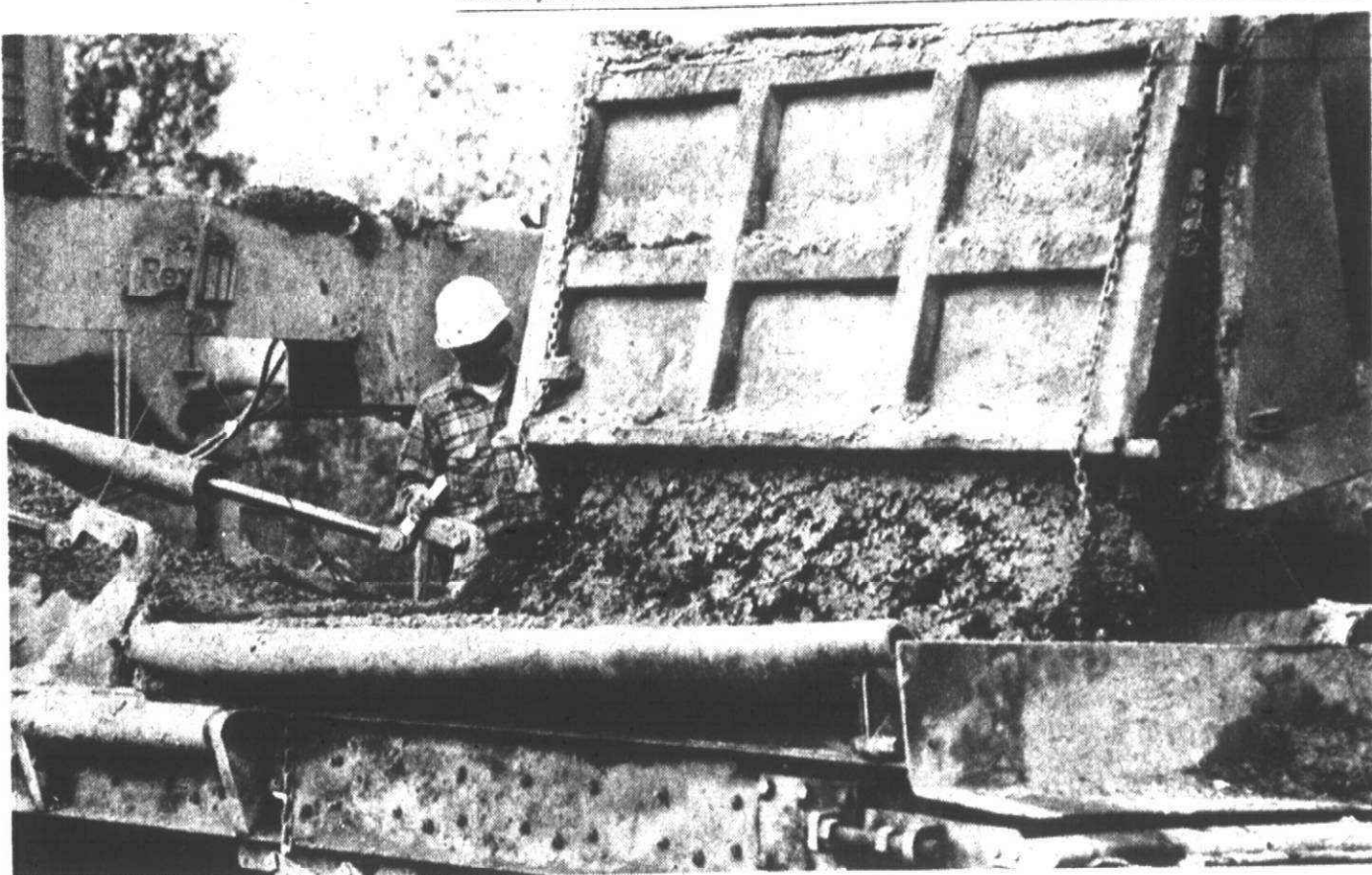

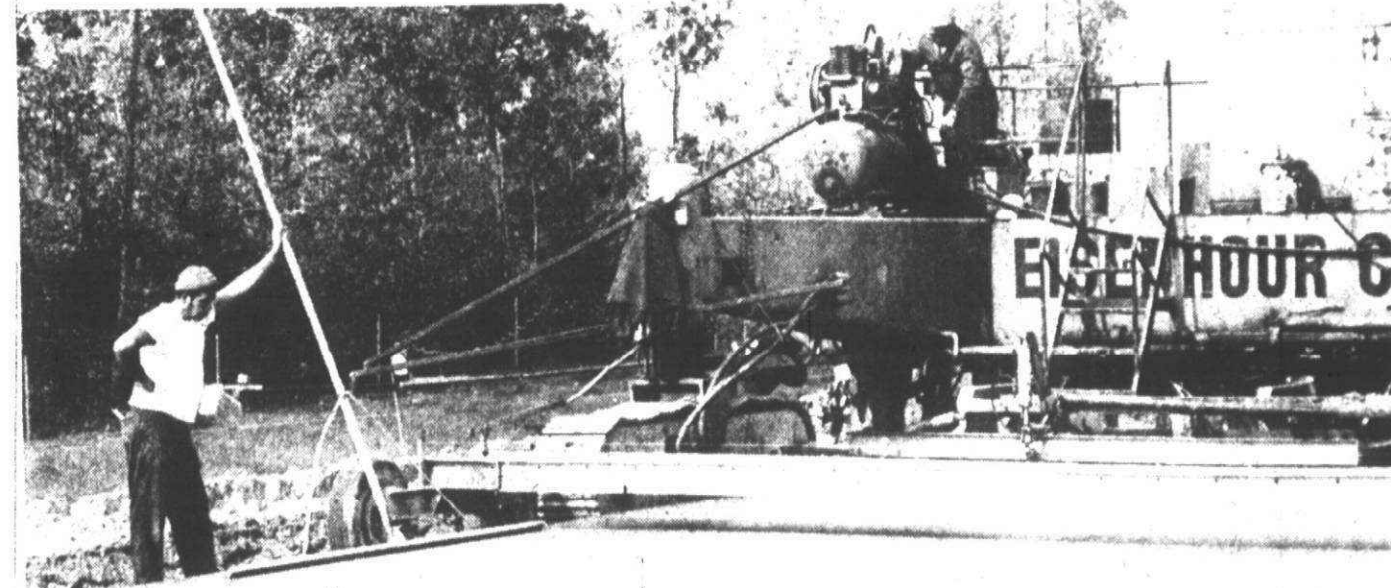

# **Readers' forum** **Bundarin answers letter**

**Editor:**  
In response to a letter in which concerned Canton citizens requested candidates to discuss issues other than the same old hackneyed ones. I accept this challenge.

•On roads—As long as Canton is a township, and it should stay in this status for the present, it does not have the authority or resources to pave its roads. Under my administration however, Canton will purchase a road grader to keep our dirt roads at least in a safe, passable condition.

•On doctors and dentists—Without office space in Canton, doctors and dentists cannot set up their practices even if they wanted to. Under my administration, I will actively encourage more capital investments in Canton.

•On an emergency medical center—Under my plans, an authority will be established by the two townships, Canton and Plymouth, and the City of Plymouth to operate the Canton-Plymouth Metropolitan Police Force. The operating powers of this authority can be expanded to include an emergency medical center at the central police headquarters.

•On recreation facilities—The Plymouth Canton School District owns many undeveloped acres of land throughout the township which should be put to immediate recreational use. Canton needs more baseball and football fields close to the different subdivisions, and this property will help. Also, instead of Canton applying for federal funds for a grandiose township hall which we couldn't afford to maintain, funds should be requested to use for recreation centers such as an ice skating rink and a large enclosed field house for community events and a farmers' market.

•On deteriorating sections of Canton—On exterior maintenance inspection ordinance and an occupancy should be applied to all rental units. Further, an occupancy ordinance should be passed on the sale of all used homes.

•On traffic lights—Canton, with the permission of Wayne County, does have the authority to install traffic lights at intersections where the local community feels they are required. Canton should obtain an agreement with Wayne County that when Canton feels a traffic light is required where the intersection does not meet the county's standards for one, the county will later reimburse the township for a light when the intersection does meet county standards for installation.

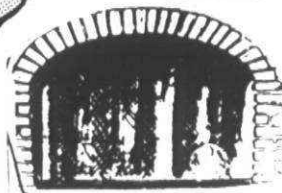

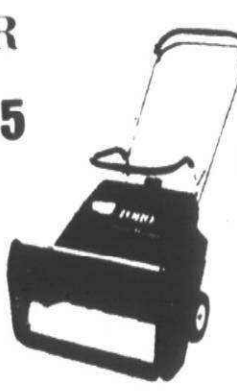

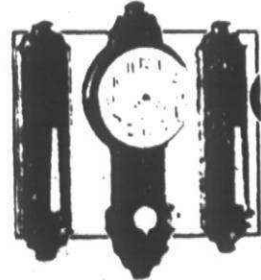

## At Starkweather

# Extra dab of kindness will do

The kids and faculty members at Starkweather Elementary School believe there's something a little special about the people in their school.

It's an extra dab of kindness, a "thank you" at the lunch table and a child opening a classroom door for his teacher. It's a cheerful "good morning" at the start of another school day and genuine concern when a pupil falls ill.

It's hard to describe, says John Howe, principal of the school, but a noticeable change has transformed the kids at Starkweather, since a Plymouth Soroptimist Club member first launched her citizenship project in Starkweather's classrooms three years ago.

"It's hard to describe," Mrs. Moore said of her project, which recently placed second internationally at the Soroptimist International Club's convention in Boston. "It's trying to get students to think of others and do for others wherever there's a need without expecting pay."

"You just can't put it in words. You

have to see the children carrying a teacher's books or talking to people or holding a door for someone.

"By doing these things, we help build a better community. We all have the capacity to be angry and to take and to steal. We all have the capacity to love and hate. But we all have to learn right from wrong and channel our feelings in the right direction."

A RETIRED TEACHER who spent 20 years as a school consultant in mental health for the Wayne County Intermediate School District, Mrs. Moore says she has seen her share of hate and stealing and anger in schools throughout southeastern Michigan.

As an honorary member of the Plymouth Soroptimist Club, Mrs. Moore recalls pondering the problems of destructive behavior and vandalism in schools at a Soroptimist Club meeting three years ago.

If only children could be taught right from wrong at a young age, she thought, what a better society this could be.

Those thoughts paved the way for the start of Mrs. Moore's citizenship program. She chose Starkweather as a target school ("I don't know why," she says), and began visiting every grade and classroom in the school.

She constructed a poem about the "golden keys"—"excuse me," "thank you," "good morning"—to impress upon younger students the need to express concern and kindness to others. She composed stories about boys and girls of every culture who reaped awards through their kindness to others.

With older students, Mrs. Moore talked about patriotism and the country's flag and Constitution. Teachers encouraged students to write essays about Mrs. Moore's words and distributed golden keys made of paper to students who did good deeds.

MRS. MOORE visited each classroom three or four times a year to reinforce her work, and assemblies were held at the end of the school year to honor students with the most "golden keys." Mrs. Moore is about to begin the program's third year.

"It's just the atmosphere around here,"

said Howe. "It's not what it used to be, and I'm sure this program helped. It's improved, as these children have been exposed to the 'golden keys.' In short, the program's been a huge success."

"The child comes to us as a whole person," Howe continued. "You must first deal with his attitude, and then the learning comes."

Howe said Starkweather, like all schools, has had its bouts with vandalism. But such incidents, he adds, have never been fewer than during the last three years.

For Mrs. Moore, the citizenship program is marked with strings of personal awards and a sense of accomplishment. Wherever she goes in Plymouth: to the dime store, to the grocery store or a leisurely stroll through Kellogg Park, she is greeted with the friendly, eager recognition of Starkweather pupils, who ask her to become a permanent fixture in Starkweather School.

"I think the kids are really growing," she says with a smile. "Everytime they see me, they say, 'Mrs. Moore, Mrs. Moore.' It's really been rewarding. I've had a lot of fun. I know."



# Agreement averts S'craft strike

Schoolcraft College and Faculty Forum negotiators were expected by this weekend to have finished hammering out a new two-year collective bargaining agreement amid signs of dissension on both the board of trustees and in the faculty ranks.

Ratification votes are expected to be held the last week of October, according to a college spokesman, with the faculty ratifying first.

A strike was avoided Monday when the faculty voted last Friday to accept the board's final offer on an economic package.

THERE WERE confused indications of how much the economic package will be worth to the faculty.

Forum President Richard Arlen said it would be worth three per cent the first year and 4.5 per cent the second.

A board source, however, put the actual cost in the four to 5.5 per cent range. The reason is that fringe benefits will increase by about one per cent as base pay increases.

These figures all exclude "increments"—the annual seniority increases teachers get. Increments are a minor factor at Schoolcraft, though, where 72 per cent of the full time faculty are at the top of the 11-step pay scale due to seniority and will get no further seniority increments.

CURRENTLY, Schoolcraft instructors get these base salaries for a 36-week work year:

- With BA degree, \$10,229 to start and \$16,611 after 10 years. There are 13 instructors in this category, and five are at the top of the scale.
- With MA degree, \$11,242 to start and \$19,479 after 11 years. There are 96 in this category, and 68 are at the top of the scale.
- With MA degree plus 30 credit hours, \$11,804 to start and \$20,078 after 11 years. There are 44 persons in this group, with 37 at the top of the scale.
- With PhD degree, \$12,367 to start and

\$20,675 after 11 years. There are nine in this category with six at the top of the scale.

Altogether, Schoolcraft has 162 full time instructors and 116 are at the top of their scales.

Librarians and counselors get the base pay plus 25 per cent because they work proportionately more weeks during the year.

THE FACULTY accepted the board's final offer Friday by a margin of less than 1½ votes—73.2 in favor to 71.8 opposed.

Reason for the fractional votes is that part-time instructors are entitled to less than a full vote.

With 162 full time and some 170 part-time instructors in the bargaining unit, it was clear that vast numbers of union members failed to vote.

Arlen called it the closest vote he has seen in his seven years of negotiating.

AT LEAST TWO members of the board of trustees privately indicated to the Observer they were dissatisfied with the economic package, and one threatened to vote against it.

That board member thought the settlement too expensive in terms of what the financially-strapped community college has available.

The college raised tuition this year and is considering further fees increases, among other options, to balance the budget because of a drop in credit hours being taken by students.

The board was further bothered by indications that the Faculty Forum negotiating team knew in advance how far the board was willing to go. Source of the continuous "leaks" was believed to be either someone close to the president's office or, more likely, another member of the board.

THE COLLEGE administration declined to criticize the Faculty Forum for telling students to call the college last Monday to see if classes were being held.

Conceivably, the college switchboard operator could have received 10,000 telephone calls. But an announcement over radio station WJR early Monday that classes

would be held apparently stopped some calls.

Switchboard operator Jean Wilson said she received "hundreds of calls" Monday and that the situation was "chaotic" from 7 a.m., when she started work, until 10:30 a.m.

The calls began coming in at 5 a.m., before the switchboard was open, and were fielded by a public safety officer.

A printed announcement given by faculty members urged students to call seven of the eight board members and urge a "resolution of differences."

Only board vice-chairperson Rosina Raymond's name was unlisted in the Oct. 7 faculty circular.

One trustee on the list said he received

calls between 4 and 5 a.m. one day.

THE ADMINISTRATION did, however, publicly rebuke the Forum for telling students the college was "guilty" of unfair labor practices.

President C. Nelson Grote said in a bulletin to students that the board had only been "accused" of bad faith bargaining, adding: "The Faculty Forum has sat as a judge and jury. . . . The truth of the matter is none of the charges have been heard by the Michigan Employee Relations Commission."

"Of more serious concern is the appropriateness of a faculty member reading inflammatory and misleading statements in the classroom."

# Opening date for Napoleon restaurant remains in doubt

A colorful sign on Main Street reads "Opening Soon," but it may be awhile be-

fore Napoleon's Restaurant and Disco pastes its first dollar on the wall.

Chances are remote that owner Joe Nahra will start business today as originally planned due to a restraining order issued by Wayne County Circuit Judge Thomas Roumell on Aug. 20.

Charles Finlan, whose insurance agency is located directly east of Nahra's restaurant, filed the lawsuit challenging the adequacy of parking spaces available for Napoleon's Restaurant.

Finlan is worried that the opening of the new restaurant will fill both his own personal lot and the Wiedman Lot, which accompanying businesses feel is already overcrowded.

NAHRA CONTENTS that his diner won't open until late afternoon, thus eliminating any possible parking conflicts with Finlan and the other businesses. A meeting was held on Oct. 6 where both parties attempted to work out a compromise, but it ended in a standstill.

"We leveled with one another on a friendly basis," said George Bowles, one of Finlan's attorneys. "The meeting was nothing more than an informal discussion between lawyers. Some healthy ideas were exchanged, but nothing new came up."

Nahra saw the outcome of the meeting from a different light. "It was a complete waste of time. We tried to sit down with Finlan and work something out, but he was unwilling to cooperate."

"We have to overcome this thing and I'm trying to do it without going to court," added Nahra. "We (Finlan and Nahra) are going to be neighbors so why not settle this in a neighborly fashion? We've tried, but to no avail."

NAHRA ADMITTED that he is at a loss for alternatives except to go through the courts. He doesn't want the notoriety of being involved in a court hassle, nor the fees that go along with it.

But the courts appear to be the only solution left for the owner, who has hired employees, and is readying them for opening day. "One thing slows down another," Nahra said. "The Board of Health is waiting until we're officially set to open the doors and we've got to get a liquor's license."

"But for all practical purposes, the restaurant is ready to start serving the community. We're shooting for the middle of next week as our new opening date, or the weekend by the latest."

## State chief justice will speak here

Michigan Chief Justice Thomas G. Kavanagh will appear in Plymouth Oct. 22 as guest speaker of the Rotary Club.

The meeting will begin at noon in the Mayflower Meeting House. The public is invited to attend.

Kavanagh, a Troy resident, has been a member of the Michigan Supreme Court since 1968 and was elected chief justice in 1975. As chief justice he supervises an 18-judge Court of Appeals and nearly 150 trial-level courts.

After 20 years as a practicing attorney, Kavanagh came to the bench in 1964 when he was elected one of the nine original members of the State Court of Appeals. He was elected four years later to an eight-year term to the supreme court and is now senior justice on the seven-member court.

Kavanagh, 58, was born into a family atmosphere of public service. His father, a newspaper man in Bay City and Detroit, served as an Internal Revenue collector. His grandfather, George Washington Kavanagh, was a printer, publisher of the weekly Bay City Democrat and onetime sheriff of Bay County.

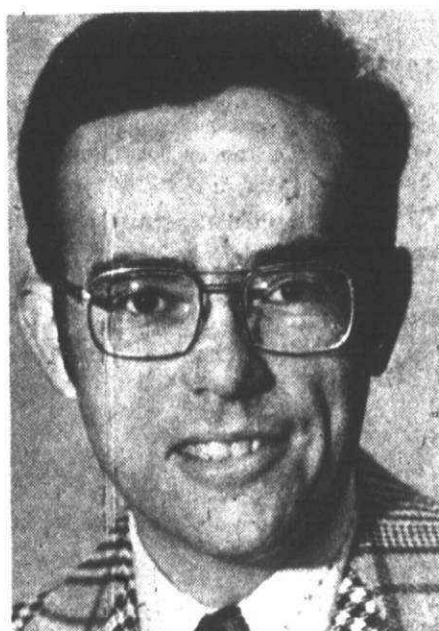
Justice Kavanagh graduated with a BA in 1938 from University of Notre Dame and earned his law degree in 1943 from the University of Detroit.

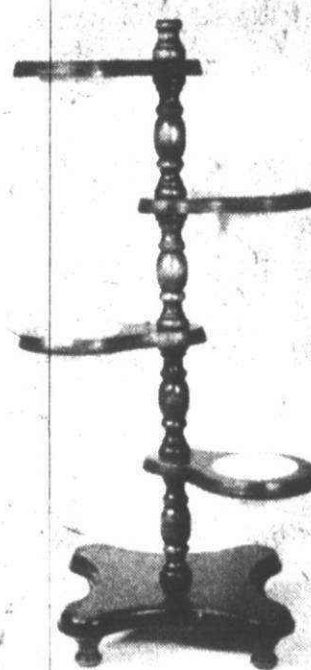

# Local LWV is opposing tax limit

An increase in local taxation is one of the fallouts likely to result if voters statewide approve Proposal C on the Nov. 2 general election ballot.

That word of caution was issued this week by the League of Women Voters of Northville, Plymouth, Canton, Novi when it came out and urged residents to vote against Proposal C.

**THE MAIN POINTS** of Proposal C are as follows:

- Limit all state taxes and spending to 8.3 per cent of the combined personal income of Michigan.
- Provide for refund of excess revenue to individual taxpayers.
- Prohibit the state from adopting or expanding local programs without full state funding.
- Prohibit local governments from increasing existing taxes without voter approval.
- The League is opposed to Proposal C, and offers as some of the reasons for a "no" vote because:
- The measure would shift burden of taxation to local level where millage battles

will have to be fought on a continued basis.

- Tax credits now enjoyed by senior citizens, the blind, farmers, and homeowners will be in jeopardy.

The proposal runs counter to recent efforts to achieve equity in the state's tax structure and fiscal responsibility.

**THE PROPOSAL** is to establish a constitutional limit on the total amount of taxes which may be levied by the legislature in any fiscal year.

If approved, the legislature would not be permitted to impose taxes of any kind which, together with all other revenues of the state (except for federal aid) would total more than 8.3 per cent of the personal income of Michigan residents from the previous fiscal year.

The proposal would allow this limit to be exceeded at the governor's request by having the legislature declare an emergency by a two-thirds vote of the House and Senate.

The proposal also would prevent the state from beginning any new program or increasing the level of any existing service

unless a state appropriation is made and disbursed.

Units of local government also are prohibited from increasing the "rate or base of existing taxes beyond levels authorized" without a vote of the people.

**THE LEAGUE** opposes the measure because it contradicts its position that the legislature should have broad and fundamental taxing power, free of constitutional restrictions.

"This proposal would further limit the ability of the elected representatives of the people in their responsibility to appropriate revenue to support programs they believe appropriate for the citizens of the state," points out Annalee Mathes, League president.

The League also opposes Proposal C because the limit of 8.3 per cent is "arbitrary and certainly will not stand the test of time;" the definition of "personal income of Michigan" is tied into a report by the U.S. Department of Commerce which may not be valid; and, the "total amount of taxes" isn't sufficiently defined.

The proposal's reference to restricting

legislative requirements for new programs at the local government level would appear to pose a constant problem of definition, the League maintains.

"The entire document seems not to take into account the need for flexibility in both providing services and paying for them," adds Mrs. Mathes. "It would appear to place undue restraints on state government at a time when more and more services are being funded by state government, and it does introduce even more rigidity in our constitution which we believe is even now much too burdened with restrictions."

A major concern of the League is that Proposal C, if adopted, would make almost impossible current attempts to provide for a more equitable method of school financing.

Although limiting state taxing powers and spending, the League points out, there would be some necessary expenditures which would be shifted to local governmental units placing a greater burden and strain on local municipalities.

# Isbister mothers seek galvanized pipe lengths

Is there anyone who needs some galvanized lengths of pipe in the house? If so, there are some Plymouth women who would like to make you a deal. As a result of a small lack of technical expertise, Jan Morton, Rose Houle, and Sue Beale, all mothers of Isbister School students, are stuck with seven, 12-foot lengths of pipe and nine, eight-foot lengths that they cannot use.

"What we need is to find someone who is

interested in buying or exchanging, so we can get the right size," said Mrs. Houle.

NOW, A NATURAL question would be how did these women arrive at their present situation. And in the answer, lies a tale.

About two years ago, the aforementioned moms thought it would be a good idea to build a fort for kids to play on at Isbister Elementary. "We were just some mothers trying to think of something we could build to keep the kids busy," said Mrs. Houle. "And we thought a fort would be something we could handle."

So, toward that goal, they purchased \$500 worth of railroad ties and got a company in Detroit to donate the 1 1/2-inch pipe. With pipe and ties in hand, they thought they were all ready to begin construction. So, some husbands were recruited to drill 1 1/2-inch holes in the wooden ties.

"THEY WORKED outside in the heat and the rain, and they drilled 280 holes; and, believe me, it was tough work," Mrs. Houle said.

However, after all the holes were finished, and everything was ready to be assembled, a slight miscalculation was discovered. "What we didn't know," stated Mrs. Houle, "was that the inside diameter

of the pipe was 1 1/4 inches; the outside diameter is 1 1/2 inch larger. The pipes won't fit in the holes we drilled."

THE FIRST, and perhaps the most obvious solution that was suggested was to drill the holes 1/4 inch bigger. No problem, right? Not so.

After several attempts and several failures, it became apparent that it was going to be impossible to enlarge the existing openings.

"The railroad ties were hard to drill through anyway, and with the holes already there, the drill-bit wouldn't stay straight," Mrs. Houle said.

For a short while it looked like a solution was forthcoming when Harold Gaertner, vocational director for Plymouth School District, volunteered to design and build a special bit.

"We used some surplus material and had both students and teachers working on it," Gaertner said. "But it was a failure; and as of right now, it's back to the drawing board."

Gaertner added that although they were going to design another bit, he was not optimistic about its success.

# Meetings are mercifully shorter

Three weeks ago an editorial ran in the Canton Observer stating that Canton Township's board meetings would try the patience of Buddhist monk.

The editorial was in response to the two previous meetings which lasted well beyond midnight. The Sept. 14 Canton board meeting lasted until 2:40 a.m.—which had to be a dubious record.

Since that editorial the board members have "cleaned up their act," to use a popular phrase. Tuesday night's meeting was over before 9 p.m. and nothing on the agenda was glossed over or hurriedly passed.

So, this editorial is a tip of the hat to the Canton Township board members for turning down the hot air valve. The people of Canton want to participate and attend the public meetings. Thanks for making it possible for people other than insomniacs.

**STILL ON** the subject of public attendance at township meetings, it was discouraging to see the pitiful turnout of citizens and political hopefuls at last week's public hearing on the 1977 budget.

Supervisor candidate Harold Stein has blasted the present administration for spending money "that isn't budgeted for" on the police reserve unit. Stein was not in attendance, though, when the 1977 budget came up for public comment.

Anne Bradley, candidate for treasurer on the Stein slate, also was noticeably absent from the budget hearing. Aside from the current members of the township board, the only politicians in the audience were Bart Berg (Republican candidate

for treasurer) and Joyce Willis, write-in candidate for trustee.

The absence of anyone on the Stein slate is hard to justify. We'd like to hear their reasons for staying away from the public hearing.

**PEOPLE WHO** might quarrel with our editorial positions are urged and invited to write letters to the editor which we run in every edition. However, this response is apparently not enough for some.

Last week a Canton Observer newspaper coin

box was robbed of all its papers, bludgeoned by a baseball bat or other blunt instrument and dumped in the middle of Canton Center Road. This attack on an inanimate object was followed by anonymous calls stating that the newspaper's editorials were biased.

To the mental giant who beats up on newspaper boxes, we say watch out for the bogeyman. It could be your own reflection, and that has to be frightening.

## The high price of litter

The Litter Lobby—those businesses and unions who make money from throwaways—will stoop to nothing in their efforts to block voter approval of Proposal A, which would ban throwaway beverage cans and bottles.

With slick, expensive radio commercials, the Litter Lobby, which calls itself "Committee Against Forced Deposits," is telling folks the prices of pop and beer will soar if Proposal A is passed Nov. 2. The Litter Lobby is wrong for many reasons.

•Pop and beer prices will not be raised because of a ban on throwaways. Rather, you would pay a deposit once and get your money back when you return the bottles; or if you buy more beverages, the bottles you return will cover the deposit on the bottles you take out. The Litter Lobby is telling a whopper again by scaring folks with that high price talk.

•The cost of having throwaway cans and bottles is not zero. Smashed bottles on roads harm tires. Broken bottles and rusted cans on treelawns and in parks hurt kids and pets. Litter along rural roads is a hazard to farm implements, truck tires, livestock and crops.

Those costs aren't reflected in the prices of pop and beer, but they are reflected in medical costs, in veterinary costs, in road maintenance costs, in auto owners' costs, in homeowners' costs, in farmers' costs.

•Litter generates more litter. When slobbs throw away a "non-returnable" or "convenience" can or bottle, it weakens everybody's respect for a clean environment.

Having throwaway cans and bottles is a luxury Michigan can no longer afford. By passing Proposal A Nov. 2, we can ban those throwaways. Don't let those expensive commercials about "forced deposits" trick you.

If you, too, are outraged at the Litter Lobby, there are many organizations you can join to fight for passage of Proposal A.

One is a local affiliate of Michigan United Conservation Clubs, which spearheaded the drive to put the proposal on the ballot. It is basically a hunting- and fishing-oriented group.

Another is East Michigan Environmental Action Council, One Northfield Plaza, Troy. Call Betty Wolfe, volunteer coordinator, at 879-6040.

# SEMTA: Camel, platypus and wombat

On balance, the Michigan Legislature did the right thing in giving the Southeastern Michigan Transportation Authority (SEMTA) power to raise \$12.5 million a year toward a rapid transit system.

But the way the legislature "restructured" the regional transit system's board must make one shudder. If a camel is a horse designed by a committee, then the new SEMTA board is the offspring of a camel, a duck-billed platypus and a wombat.

Since the board was established in 1968, the selection system has been fairly rational: The Southeast Michigan Council of Governments picked six members and the governor three.

**OAKLAND AND WESTERN** Wayne counties, in particular, get a raw deal from the "restructuring."

Consider: Detroit gets five members on the new 15-member SEMTA board. All are appointed by the mayor—but not subject to confirmation by the city council. That's poor procedure, but that's what Mayor Coleman A. Young wants.

Oakland County has an executive. But does the Oakland County executive get to appoint the county's three SEMTA board members? No. One is picked by the county board of commissioners and two by SEMCOG. County Executive Dan Murphy thinks the new formula is a snub to Oakland's pioneering work with the executive system, and he's

absolutely right. What's sauce for Detroit ought to be sauce for Oakland County, too.

The "restructuring" would have made far more sense had the county executive been given the power of appointment subject to confirmation by the county board.

**OAKLAND GETS** a bad deal another way.

The weirdos in Macomb County have been too provincial to join SEMCOG. So the legislature actually awarded this provinciality, this civic isolationism, by allowing the Macomb County board to appoint both of Macomb's SEMTA board members.

But the good guys in Oakland, who have remained loyal to SEMCOG, get kicked in the chops because Oakland County gets to make only one of its SEMTA appointments itself; the other two Oakland seats will be filled through the SEMCOG process.

# Issues, not character, should decide

I wish the presidential election were over. I am tired of hearing about lust and television blunders because they don't go to the heart of which man can do the best job of leading the nation.

Show me a man who doesn't lust and I'll show you a man who has some mental or physical ailment.

Show me a man who appears before millions on television and doesn't make a mistake and I'll show you a man who hasn't said anything of importance.

It is said that this election will be determined by the character of the candidates and not the issues involved. 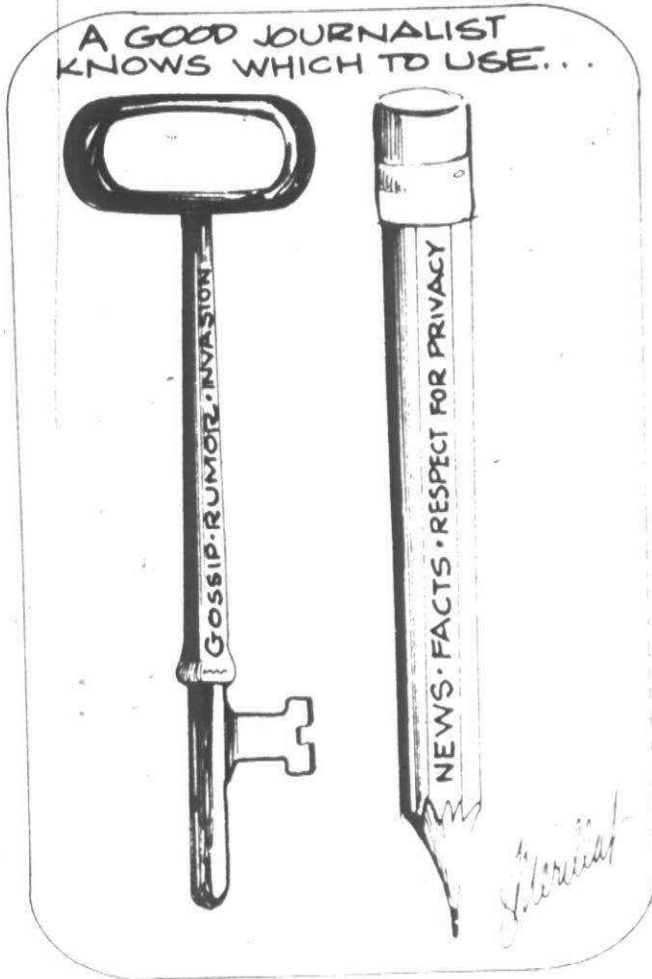
Today the average citizen is frustrated, disillusioned and angry at our institutions, which he perceives as controlling the destiny of the nation.

## Press feeding on gossip

One of the biggest topics of local political-journalistic gossip in the past few days has been the feud going on between the editors of the Detroit News and their columnist, TV commentator Lou Gordon.

In recent weeks, they have been arguing with (charitably put) might and main over the race for the U.S. Senate between Don Riegle and Marv Esch.

The News ran a series of news stories critical of Riegle; he allegedly signed his wife's name to their joint tax return and kept the refund until she asked him for it; he was ranked by national columnist Jack Anderson as among the worst members of the Congress, according to a poll of members and staffers; and he supposedly has taken a position in support of busing to integrate schools.

The News then followed these stories up with a strong editorial arguing that these were reasons why Esch should be elected to the Senate.

**GORDON** replied in a column in the News, where he has a regular slot.

He claimed that the tax return story was cooked up to embarrass Riegle just at election time; that Jack Anderson himself had not conducted the congressional popularity poll himself, and in fact would vote for Riegle if he lived in Michigan; and that Riegle was just as much against busing as anybody else.

Gordon also said some nasty things about the News' editorial ethics, suggesting that the paper consciously was slanting its news coverage of the campaign to correspond to its previously determined editorial views.

The News then replied, to the amazement of many, to Gordon in an editorial of its own. It called him some nasty names and said some disparaging things about his own ethics as a newsman.

**WHAT IS** really going on here, aside from a long standing battle between Gordon and the News (which boosts the TV ratings for one and the circulation of the other) is a violation of an old unwritten rule of journalism: Thou shalt not comment, in print at least, on the competency or ethics of another journalist.

And what, in turn, is behind this is a serious and troubling problem beginning to affect American journalism.

Ever since its great success in Watergate, our journalism has concentrated increasingly on "going behind" the facade of public statements. Journalists have started to zero in on private lives of public figures, often without taste or real public service. Did President Ford, while a Congressman, ever play golf as the weekend guest of somebody who was an executive with U.S. Steel? (Can anybody, especially a senior Congressman, really be bought by a golfing weekend?) Did Gov. Carter really fly around Georgia in planes owned by textile companies? (Unless there is evidence that Carter favored inappropriately the textile interests while he was governor, does anybody care?)

Gossip has replaced news; fact has become subordinate to rumor; the legitimate needs of public figures for some respect for their privacy has been forgotten.

And then, with no more dirt to pull out on public figures, the press in its ravening need to keep critical, aggressive and fully investigatory now starts criticizing itself in print.

**I'M NOT** suggesting that the press itself should be off limits to criticism, nor am I suggesting that members of the press should not attack obvious ineptitudes by other press people.

What I am saying is that the press runs the great risk, in its current fashionable need for gossip and criticism, of destroying its own credibility with the public.

It's like the giant in the fairy tale. He grew so great by devouring his own opponents and felt his appetite so undiminished that he finally began to feed on himself and so died.

# The Stroller... *A GOP shocker*

There was a glint in the pollster's eye when he asked: "For whom are you going to vote—Gerald Ford or Jimmy Carter?"

The Stroller had to smile. If the pollster only had realized he was born and raised in Pennsylvania, he never would have asked the question.

Back in the days when The Stroller was just graduating from knee breeches into long pants and getting his first good look at the political picture he was taught to vote for the Grand Old Party. To do otherwise would have been looked upon as a mortal sin.

AS A MATTER OF fact, in those days a Democrat was looked upon as a sort of museum piece. They were few and far between. In our little town of Catasauqua nestled in the foothills of the Blue Mountains there was only one registered Democrat.

He was an elderly, well-to-do coal dealer named George B. F. Deily. The very mention of his name causes The Stroller to recall one of the most humorous moments of a presidential election he ever has known.

It was back in 1916 when Charles Evans Hughes, the famed be-whiskered gent, ran against Woodrow Wilson, the Democratic incumbent.

IT WAS A RATHER hectic campaign in the days of World War I. Wilson was running on the theory that he could get us out of the war. And Hughes, naturally, was campaigning against Wilson—and war.

There were many political rallies with the traditional bon-fires and torch light parades. But strangely, there was none in support of Wilson in our little town.

In those days there was little of the voter apathy we have today, and while The Stroller was not yet old enough to vote he did his part by helping to get out the vote. And our little town had one of its best turnouts.

Came election day and the town was enthused over the possibility that the Republicans would win. All through the day there was great glee as reports came in that the vote was heavy and that the Republicans appeared to have a wide edge.

Long after the polls closed, no one had retired. The townspeople were awaiting the final word. There was no radio or television in those days; all we had were telegraphic reports.

About midnight, came word that Hughes apparently had won and the Republicans again would have control of the White House.

This news flash was all that was needed. In short order the Catasauqua Band was on hand, ready to march on a moment's notice.

It was no time until the torches were lit, and the signal was given to parade.

## WHERE TO?

There was only one destination—down to George Deily's home to serenade him. It

was a happy group that gathered on the old gent's porch, screaming and yelling of the victory. All the old gent did was pull down the curtains.

It was a great moment. But you can imagine the shock when the word came the next morning that Wilson had made a strong finish and was re-elected.

There was gloom in our town. Heads were shaking in surprise all around the regular meeting places. And when our young fellows gathered that evening there was little conversation—only the aggravating thoughts of the Republican defeat.

As darkness fell, there came a sound of music far down on our front street. It was marching music. As the sounds became clearer, there was no mistaking that it was a parade.

Sure enough. When the band came in sight, there was a lone marcher with a lighted torch and broad smile.

It was George B.F. Deily, the town's lone Democrat. What a time he was having getting even and celebrating the Democratic victory.

No presidential race ever will have the same effect on The Stroller.

It was the first time he was caught in a political defeat. Things have changed in Pennsylvania since those days. But the memory of Hughes's defeat and the Democratic victory he will remember always.

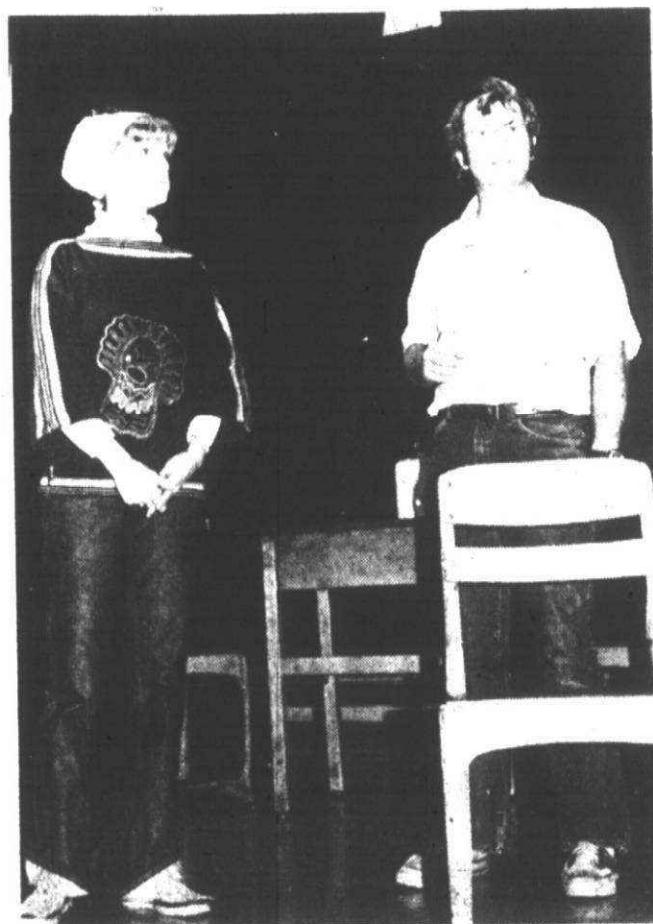

# Flu vaccine distribution here awaits study

Distribution of swine flu vaccine to residents of Wayne County will await thorough resolution of any questions raised by the deaths by heart attack of three elderly persons who received the vaccine in Pittsburgh.

Larry Lash, tri-county health department spokesman, said plans for clinics in the area are continuing "but health officials will not distribute any swine flu vaccine until the Pennsylvania situation is thoroughly resolved."

He said such information was anticipated by Oct. 18, when clinics begin operating in Wayne County. The first in this suburban area is scheduled Oct. 20.

Lash, however, said health departments here were inclined to discount the suggestion that the deaths were linked to the vaccine injections, and stated that clinics under way in Oakland County are not being discontinued.

"There have been no unexpected reactions to the vaccine received by some 1,000 persons in Oakland County to date," his statement said.

"In addition, preliminary reports indicate there is no known factor linking the deaths with the vaccine or immunization program."

AS SCHEDULED, the high risk (bivalent) phase of the inoculation program will be held 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. Oct. 20-23 in centers in Canton Township, Westland, Livonia, Plymouth and Redford Township.

This phase is aimed at high risk members of the community, including those over 60 and those chronically ill with lung, heart, kidney and such metabolic diseases as diabetes.

All persons in either the high risk group or in the general population group who are allergic to eggs, chickens or chicken feathers should consult their physicians before receiving swine flu shots.

Clinics for the general population will open in November in Livonia, Plymouth, Westland, Wayne, Garden City, Canton and Redford Township.

DR. THOMAS C. SHOPE, associate director of infectious disease at Children's Hospital, has stated that "the swine flu vaccine is as safe as others in common use, such as measles, mumps and polio."

"Since the virus used to make the vaccine has been killed, no one will get the flu from taking the vaccine."

He noted that after receiving the vaccine, some may experience slight fevers within 24 hours, and some swelling, redness and tenderness in the arm.

"Reactions to the swine flu vaccine will not be more severe than any other vaccines in common use," he said.

The shots given at public clinics will be practically painless. A relatively new development, the jet injector, will be used extensively to administer the shots.

CLINICS FOR HIGH risk groups will be held in Geneva United Presbyterian Church, 5835 Sheldon, Canton Township, and in Tonquish Creek Manor, 1160 Sheridan, Plymouth.

In Westland shots will be available in J

Building of the Wayne County General Hospital on Merriman north of Michigan, and in Room B of the Westland Shopping Center.

Livonians in the high risk group can get swine flu shots in the physical education building of Schoolcraft College, 18600 Haggerty; the Community Room near entrance G in the Livonia Mall at Middle Belt and Seven Mile, and the Senior Citizen Activities Center, Five Mile and Farmington.

Redford Township high risk residents can receive shots in Horace Mann Senior Citizens Center, 12121 Hemingway.

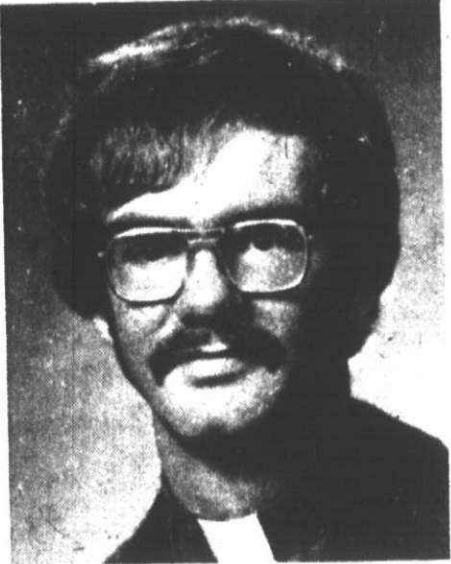

# Inner city pastor visits

# Churches can help fight crime

An inner-city clergyman, who not only thinks the church can do something about

urban crime but also has started to show the way, will make a guest visit Sunday, Oct. 17, to the Livonia Christian Church (Disciples of Christ).

Brother Lamar Clark, senior minister of United Christian Church at Sixteenth and Forest in Detroit will preach at the 11 a.m. service for the Livonia congregation that worships at 36075 Seven Mile.

He also is scheduled to speak at a men's breakfast at 8 a.m. and teach a 9:30 a.m. Sunday School class before getting to the pulpit. The Rev. William Hass, local pastor, will do the honors in the Detroit church.

Brother Clark's sermon title will be "An Unusual Question," taken from the prophet Ezekiel's words "Can these bones live?" and it's a safe bet he'll bring in some ideas gleaned during two years in the Detroit church.

In that time, while adding some 175 new adult members to his congregation, he's made an impact on his neighborhood with programs that bear titles like Pathfinder Project, Founding Fathers, Loudmouth and Pastors on Patrol, the latter two still in the organizational stages.

"THE CRIME THING is a difficult matter," he said.

"To do something about it takes resources and committed people—people willing to stay in the area, at least for a while, to let their interest be known.

"You have to realize that area is affected not only by the white flight to the suburbs but also a black flight, the more affluent moving to the edges of the city."

Brother Clark added he feels strongly the suburban church has "an obligation in mission to the urban church."

"Especially since most church people came from the urban churches," he said, "it seems a real tragedy that the suburban churches have severed themselves from their sisters."

"In the suburban churches are not only the money but the experience, the brain power and the young people. They could give physical assistance to the churches left in the inner city."

THIS MINISTER met crime in his church's area last summer with Pathfinder, a recreation program for some 60 kids in the immediate area of the building.

Partially funded by the denomination, the program had enough effect on the

neighborhood to bring about a definite reduction in vandalism.

More important, Brother Clark thought, it developed some interest and pride in the church on the part of some of the young who live in its shadow.

He hopes next to add another member to the church staff to some street counseling. It's financing that kind of church work that he feels could be a concern of more suburban churches.

In the beginning stages are more programs.

"I have a couple of men gung-ho on setting up Founding Fathers," he said. "We'll have a group of adult men ready to work with kids in the area, getting into things like little league and the sports activities you find in the suburbs."

Loudmouth, he went on, is the catch name for a telephone system he hopes to establish.

"It would be a number well publicized," he said, "that people could use to let the police know about things going on in the neighborhood."

"Part of the problem is that they have been afraid to give this information for fear of reprisal; this number would let them help without identifying themselves."

PASTORS ON PATROL is projected as an organization of westside ministers taking turns riding around in radio-equipped campers through areas where there are large numbers of crimes.

"Our presence there could help," Brother Clark believes. "We have some ministers ready to take part, and as plans get settled there will be more."

While talking of urban and suburban churches, Brother Clark mentioned that a few years ago, while serving as minister to a white congregation in Connecticut, he persuaded his parishioners to sell property at the edge of town and return to its central city ministry.

It worked out well, for that congregation, he said. So did his unusual ministry there but he said he himself ended that after two years.

"What I was doing was giving to a white congregation what I should have been giving to my black brothers," he explained.

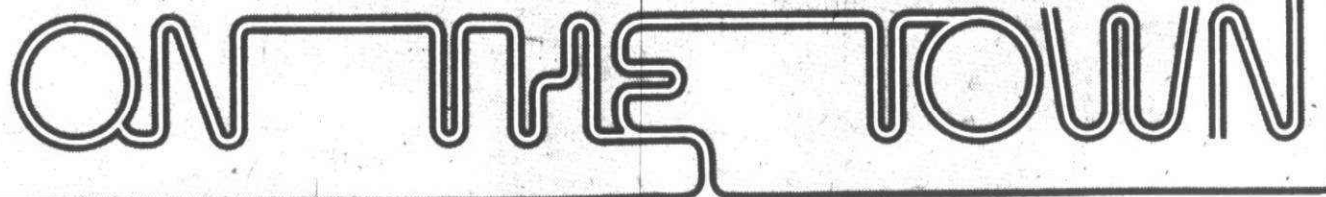

## Rocks stop RU rally for 9th cage victory

The end of the first round of Suburban Eight League girls basketball action occurred Tuesday night, as the Plymouth Salem Rocks remained undefeated with a 53-50 victory over rival Redford Union at the Panthers' gym.

The Rocks' overall record is 9-0 for the season and 7-0 in the conference. Salem stands alone in first place of the Sub-8, as its chances for a second consecutive title look stronger with each game.

Redford Union, the Rocks' closest contender last season, has lost only two games all year and gave the Rocks its toughest competition since the opening contest.

"I'm really glad we had a game with more pressure," said Salem coach Debbie Hatcher. "It was a good learning experience for our girls."

"We needed a game like this," Redford Union coach Ken Dersey complimented his squad's performance against a taller and more experienced Salem team.

"I'm proud of the way our girls played. It was a good game."

"We are a young team with only one senior. Most of our players are from the junior varsity of last year," he said.

"SALEM CONTROLLED THE game and kept its cool—that's what it's all about."

The Rocks might have kept their cool in the end, but not after the Panthers had battled back from a 16 point deficit early in the third quarter.

The Rocks held a convincing 29-19 lead at halftime and came out to score the first six points of the third quarter.

Redford Union patiently dwindled that margin to seven 41-34, after the third foul of play when Salem ran into foul trouble.

The Panthers continued to go to the charity line early in the fourth period. Redford also began to give full court pressure to the Rocks, causing numerous turnovers.

Redford cut the Plymouth lead to three, 37-34, with five minutes left in the game, but the Rocks came back with four free throws to build the lead back to seven.

The Panthers again cut the margin to three, 51-48, with only 2:20 left in the contest.

Both squads quickly traded buckets, and the defenses took over from there, not allowing any points for either side in the final 1:48 of play.

Plymouth center Diane Goodrich came up with two key rebounds at the end to secure the victory.

The Rocks built that first half margin with some full court pressure of its own, forcing the Panthers to commit sloppy errors.

The key in the ball game was Salem's overall height, which gave the Rocks two or three extra shots at the basket all night.

The Rocks were led by Doris Hoelscher, who came off the bench to score 12. Peggy Moore added 10, while Goodrich and Debbie Pitera contributed eight each.

"Redford Union is our biggest rival and I'm glad we got this win under our belts on their floor," Hatcher said.

## Salem gridders ready for battle

After Saturday night's big victory against Trenton, the Plymouth Salem football team has another crucial test in front of them.

The Rocks must face undefeated and state-ranked Dearborn Edsel Ford this Friday afternoon at the Thunderbird's field. Starting time for the contest is 3:30 p.m.

The upset victory of the Rocks against Trenton was probably a surprise to everyone—except for the team itself.

The Trojans were coming off their first loss since the 1974 season the week before. But the Rocks extended that string of defeats for another week.

While the Rocks are enjoying this victory, they can't spend time resting on their laurels as Edsel Ford looms in front of them.

"I think Edsel Ford is more dangerous (than Trenton)," coach Tom Moshimer said.

While Moshimer has high respect for the Trojans, he is wary of Ford because of a more balanced offensive attack.

Trenton emphasized the run, while Edsel can run and pass.

"We expect them to pass," he said. "They have 6 foot-three inch ends with super talent."

Moshimer doesn't plan anything special

on defense or offense but stresses the same good execution the Rocks have demonstrated the last two weeks.

"When you play a tough team you aren't going to fool them," he said. "You just have to adjust (on defense) to what they do best and execute well."

"We have to get a good pass rush—that is the secret. And I have confidence in the secondary."

Despite Trenton's two straight defeats, one of which was to Edsel, Moshimer still had high regard for the Trojans.

"I still think they (Trenton) are as good a football team as any. Unless these two losses hurt them (mentally), I wouldn't be surprised to see them go undefeated the rest of the season."

"Everyone who saw Trenton didn't think too much, but they are good."

"No one wants to give us credit for beating a good football team."

The Rocks enter Friday's battle with a 3-1 overall record and 2-1 in the league.

This is the 13th season of junior basketball in Plymouth and Canton. The program has grown over the years with more than 700 children participating.

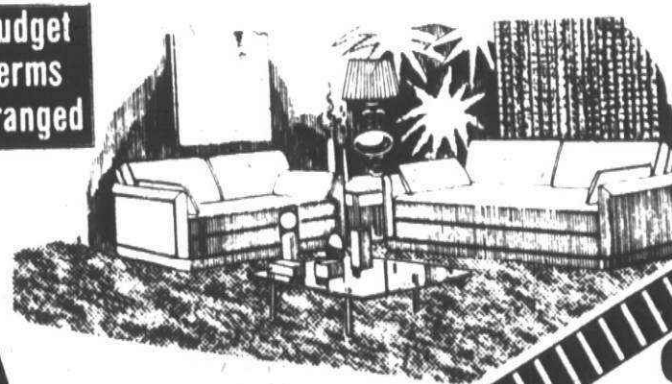

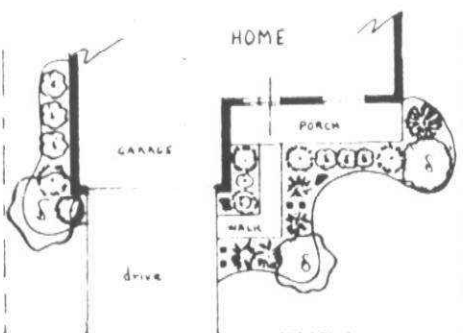

Farmington Tuesday shed its traditional bridesmaid role Tuesday afternoon at the 13th Annual Redford Union Invitational cross country meet to capture the team championship among a field of 24 entries.

The Falcons accumulated a total of 99 points, with Harold Eutal leading the charge by finishing fourth in 16:02. He was supported by Stu Glatfelter (12th-16:20), and Hugh Leidlein (13th-16:22).

Medalist honors in the event went to Livonia Churchill's Vic Wietecha, who covered the course at Cass Benton in 15:49. Wietecha edged Plymouth Salem's Scott Kleam by two seconds as Kleam hung on to the runner's-up spot in 15:51. Schoolcraft Invitational winner Ted Unold of Westland John Glenn took third place in 15:54.

For Kleam it was the second consecutive runnerup finish in four days. He placed second at the Wayne Memorial Invitational Saturday, with an incredible 14:51 clocking over that three-mile course.

Garden City West's Mark Boyd cruised home in fifth place. Churchill's Tobin Jones paced the distance in 16:05 for sixth. Livonia Stevenson's Bill Wilkin followed close behind for seventh place in 16:08. Wilkin was the lead runner for the Spartans

who finished second in the team standing...one point ahead of John Glenn. Rounding out the top ten were Ken Morris of Trenton (16:11) Mike Mayes of Walled Lake Western (16:12), and Mark Evans of Farmington Harrison (16:14).

The consensus among coaches and meet officials centered around the climate in which the race was run. Humid weather and temperatures in the mid 70's were obviously not conducive to fast times, especially over a grueling course like Cass Benton.

Veteran followers of the Michigan football team are keeping their fingers crossed after what happened before the 104,211 fans last Saturday afternoon.

They had seen the Wolverines conquer Michigan State, 40-10, but there was more to the game than the final score. They had seen the Spartans complete 25 passes during the afternoon and they also groaned when the supposedly Michigan power house failed to score in each of two occasions inside the five-yard line. And one of these was from the one-yard line.

"Desite all the speed and power," one of the old grads confided in the press box, "the team still doesn't have good pass defense. And that failure at the one-yard line was inexcusable. It was a reminder of the day at Ohio State several years ago when they let the Rose Bowl slip through their fingers by failing to get the winning touchdown in four tries from the one yard line."

Aside from these two weaknesses the Wolverines fumbled more than have done in a game in a long while— and each fumble proved costly.

Neither Northwestern nd Indiana, whom the Wolverines meet on the road during the next two weeks, should furnish any trouble.

But slips like fumbles against State and weak pass defense could raise havoc.

Otherwise the team is looking forward to writing some new chapters in the record book. If Michigan downs Northwestern Coach "Bo" Schembechler will get his seventy-second victory and pass the legendary Fritz Crisler in career triumphs.

Jim Wood, the fancy little kicker, also will be shooting for two marks—the record for field goals and the number of kickoffs that travel into the end zone.

And all eyes will be on Rob Lytle, the all-around back who is aiming at the all-time career rushing record of 3,072 yards now held by Billy Taylor. Lytle now has 2,367 yards to his credit. He also set a Ten Big record against Michigan State when he averaged 18 yards a carry on 10 carries.

The statistics against Northwestern should be interesting.

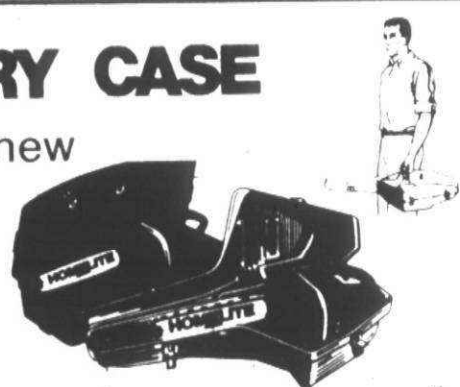

# We Go Easy shocks all

The shock waves are still being felt around the stables at Livonia's Detroit Race Course over the outcome of last Saturday's special \$20,000 match race between the Appaloosa filly We Go Easy and the thoroughbred Right Pocket.

Almost everyone expected it to be another cake walk for the speedy 7-year-old gelding, Right Pocket, but, in a typical "proof is in the pudding" story, it was We Go Easy the winner by 1½ lengths at the finish of the quarter-mile dash.

What the thoroughbred supporters didn't understand was that Right Pocket was dealing with one of the fastest Appaloosas ever bred. She is a rare animal, and her owner, Gene Miles of Wichita, admitted she is the only Appaloosa that can beat Right Pocket or a thoroughbred of similar ability.

The match race was We Go Easy's last trip to the racetrack. Miles is retiring her to become a broodmare on his ranch in Kansas and plans to breed her to Shecky Greene, who was the national thoroughbred sprint champion two years ago.

With seven full weeks remaining in the 1976 thoroughbred season at the DRC, officials of the Livonia track are contemplating an alteration of the racing schedule. Rumors are that the track will go to a five-day race week which would include Sunday racing.

Sunday racing was generally viewed as a success at the DRC when it was tried in 1975, but prohibitive costs due to double time salaries for union employees made it unfeasible. Reports are that talks are under way with union leaders concerning Sunday racing for the remainder of the meet.

And with seven weeks left, jockey Wayne Catalano seems a virtual certainty to win the honors of leading rider. The 20-year-old New Orleans born rider had 87 victories through last Monday with runner-up Ramon Perez having tallied 55 wins. Perez is the defending DRC champ, having won 96 races at last year's meet.

Catalano should also become the sixth rider ever to ride 100 or more winners at a DRC meet. The others were: Johnny Sellers (100) in 1957; Bobby Gallimore (116) in 1966; David Whited (119) in 1967; Larry Snyder (132-121-162) in 1969-'70-'73; and Glen Brogan (102) in 1974.

Jack Van Berg just about has the trainer standings locked up, holding a 49-26 advantage over Jack Foran, last year's leading trainer at the Livonia mile track.

Van Berg of Columbus, Neb., captured the leading trainer title at DRC in 1964, '65, '67, '68, and in '72 and '73. Jack's father, Marion Van Berg, won the trainer title in the DRC's infancy between the years 1949 and 1953. The elder Van Berg missed out in 1954 but came back to win it the following year.

This year marks the 28th year of thoroughbred racing under the DRC banner and when Van Berg adds another title to his record, it will mark the 13th time in 28 years that a Van Berg has been leading trainer.

Saturday's feature will be the sweetest day purse, a \$10,000 race at six furlongs for the top 3-year-old sprinters at the track. The race will be the ninth on the 10-race card which gets under way with a 2 p.m. posttime.

## Salem linksmen tied in loop race

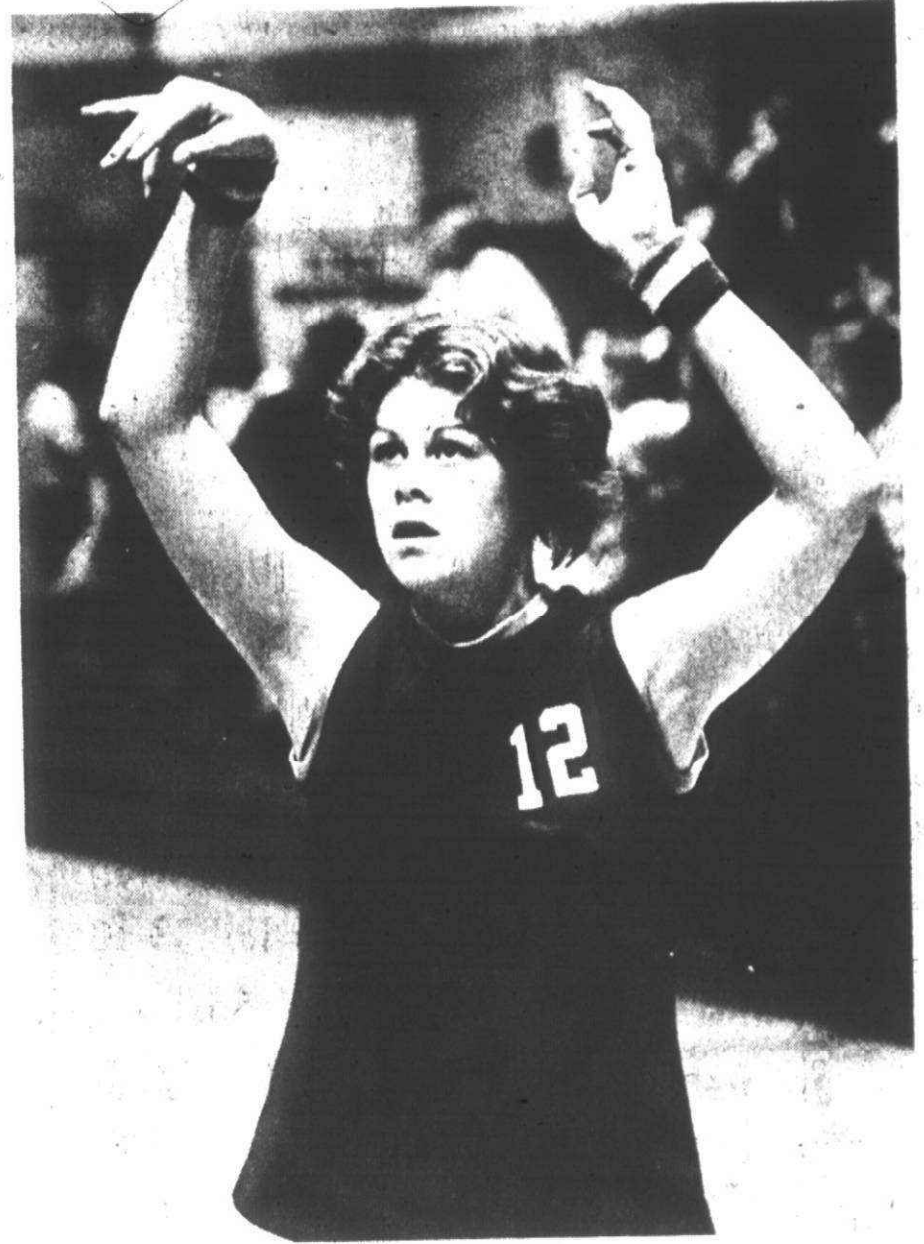
Salem warmed up for the regional test by defeating Allen Park in a nine hole match Monday at Brae Burn, beating the Jaguars, 162-181.

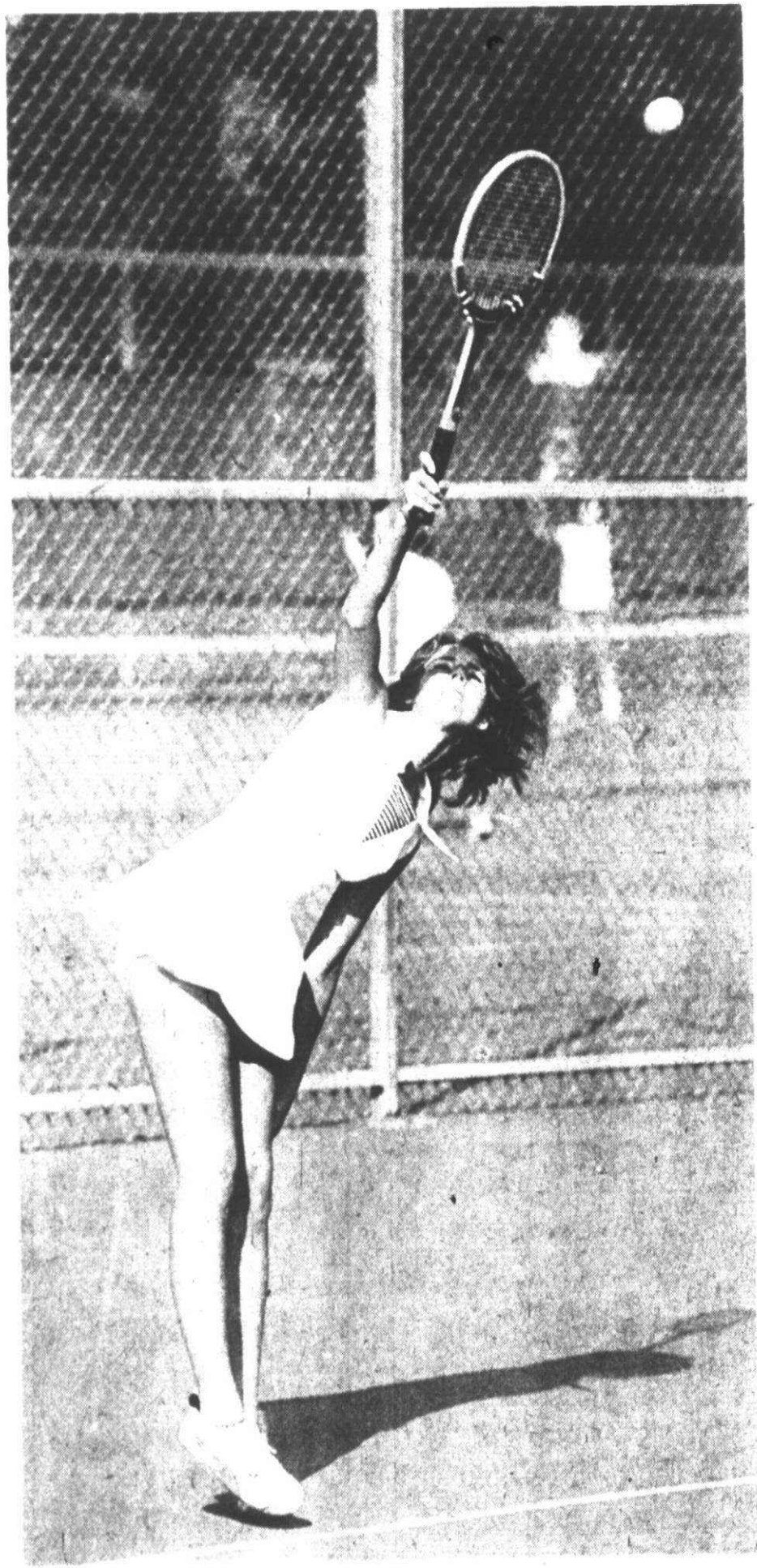
Canton's senior captain, Steve Morman, after a poor start, came back strong and added a 41 to the Chiefs' final score. Gary
